- **Sharing**: Does the project application include a method of sharing the results with others? If so, will they be shared widely so others may learn from it, just across the college or discipline, or just in a single department?
- **Collaboration**: Does the project propose a collaboration with other faculty, another grant, or involvement with another project? Will this increase the potential for success or impact of the project?
